Dear Sir/ Madam,

1. The National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA) is implementing a UNEP-supported, GEF7-funded project titled UrbanShift (Livable Cities in India: Demonstrating Sustainable Urban Planning and Development through Integrated Approaches). The project aims to transform Indian cities through integrated urban planning, which would lead to reducing GHG emissions, air pollution and congestion, protecting and conserving ecologically sensitive areas by building capacity of state and city authorities. The objective of the project is to demonstrate low emissions, resilient, nature-based inclusive, sustainable urban development in selected cities and support scale-up nationally. The project would provide technical assistance and investment for undertaking the following activities in the partner cities of Pune, Surat, Agra & Puducherry:

- Evidence-based sustainable and integrated planning;
- Investments in low emissions, resilient, Nature-based Solutions (NbS) and mobility;
- Innovative financing solutions for cities and
- Knowledge management and capacity development: Knowledge products, good practices and tools would be made available to national, state and city authorities as well as other stakeholders through the National Urban Learning Platform (NULP).

The project will also focus on enabling gender mainstreaming practices and processes through the inclusion of gender expertise, stakeholder consultations with women, adoption of gender-responsive planning and budgeting processes and mandatory gender assessment of all urban development projects.

With this background, NIUA (hereinafter called “Client”) invites proposals from Consultants through an open RFP process to prepare Corridor and Junction Improvement Plan (C&JIP) for the following stretches in Pune:

** Improvement plans have to be prepared for the entire Right of Way (RoW) and junctions along/ on this corridor. However, the plans must consider the alignment, entry-exit points and other similar aspects of the adjoining National Highway that influence the flow of traffic, connectivity, and overall functionality of the transportation network.*

This RfP pertains to the development of C&JIP for Package 3, i.e. Corridor 1: Rajmata Jijau Bhosale Chowk to D Mart Chowk, Handewadi, Corridor 2: Khadi Machine Chowk to Mantarwadi Chowk.

2. Further details of the Services are provided in the Terms of Reference (TOR)
3. The RFP include the following Sections:

4. The RFP shall be published on the NIUA Tenders website, and is free of cost for download.
 5. Bid Security / Earnest Money Deposit (EMD) is not required for the submission of the proposal. A Bid Security Declaration should be submitted along with Technical Proposal.
 6. The method of selection for all the above-mentioned outputs is **Quality cum Cost Based Selection (QCBS) with a ceiling amount of INR 37,00,000/- (Rupees Thirty-three Lakh only), inclusive of all taxes.** The Financial Bids exceeding the ceiling amount will be rejected and will not be considered in the evaluation. The Agencies (Bidders) are requested to provide their best Technical and Financial Bids. Additional details are provided in **Section III: Evaluation and Qualification** of this RFP Document.
 7. Submission of Performance Bank Guarantee by the selected bidder would be required before the award of work.
 8. **Any queries in relation to the bid process shall be sent to email ID: procurement@niua.org and urbanshift.pmu@niua.org before 11.12.2025, 17:00 hrs IST. Response to the queries will be available online by 18.12.2025.**
 9. **The Proposal shall comprise of Proposal Submission Form, Technical Proposal and Financial Proposal, and must be submitted to the NIUA Office (1st Floor, Core 4B, India Habitat Centre Lodhi Road, New Delhi- 110003) by 06.01.2026, 17:00 hrs IST.**
 10. The Consultants will be required to make a presentation of their Technical Proposal during the technical evaluation stage.
 11. An Integrity Pact attached as **Appendix – D** shall be signed with the successful bidder before the award of work.
 12. The issue of the RFP does not imply that the NIUA is bound to select bid(s), and it reserves the right without assigning any reason to,
 - reject any or all of the bids, or
 - cancel the tender process; or
 - abandon the procurement process; or
 - issue another bid for identical or similar work.

Section I - Instructions to Consultants (ITC)

A. General Provisions

- 1 Definitions
 - 1.1 "**Affiliate(s)**" means an individual or an entity that directly or indirectly controls, is controlled by, or is under common control with the Consultant.
 - 1.2 "**Applicable law**" means the laws and any other instruments having the force of law in India, as they may be issued and in force from time to time.
 - 1.3 "**NIUA**" means National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA).
 - 1.4 "**Bidder/ Consultant**" means a legally-established professional consulting firm or an entity that may provide or provides the Services to the Client under the Contract.
 - 1.5 "**Client**" means the implementing agency that signs the Contract for the Services with the selected Consultant.
 - 1.6 "**NIUA**" means National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA).
 - 1.7 "**Contract**" means a legally binding written agreement signed between the Client and the Consultant. It includes all the attached documents like the General Conditions of Contract (GCC), the Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) and the Appendices.
 - 1.8 "**Consortium**" means an association of two or more companies or organisations (or any combination of these entities) with the objective of participating in a common activity or pooling their resources for achieving a common goal.
 - 1.9 "**Data Sheet**" means an integral part of the Instructions to Consultants (ITC) Section II that is used to reflect specific country and assignment conditions to supplement, but not to over-write, the provisions of the ITC.
 - 1.10 "**Day**" means a calendar day.
 - 1.11 "**Experts**" means, collectively, Key Experts, Non-Key Experts, or any other personnel of the Consultant, Subconsultant or Joint Venture member(s).
 - 1.12 "**Joint Venture (JV)**" means an association with or without a legal personality distinct from that of its members, of more than one Consultant where the lead member has the authority to conduct all business for and on behalf of any and all the members of the JV, and where the members of the JV are jointly and severally liable to the Client for the performance of the Contract.
 - 1.13 "**Key Expert(s)**" means an individual professional provided by the Consultant or its Subconsultant, whose skills, qualifications, knowledge and experience are critical to the performance of the Services under the Contract and whose CV is taken into account in the technical evaluation of the Consultant's Proposal.
 - 1.14 "**ITC**" (this Section I of the RFP) means the Instructions to Consultants that provide the Consultants with all information they need to prepare their Proposals.
 - 1.15 "**LOI**" means the Letter of Invitation being sent by the Client to the Consultants.
 - 1.16 "**Non-Key Expert(s)**" means an individual professional provided by the Consultant or its Subconsultant and who is assigned to perform the Services or any part thereof under the Contract and whose CVs are not evaluated individually.
 - 1.17 "**Proposal**" means the Technical Proposal and the financial Proposal of the Consultant.
 - 1.18 "**RFP**" means the Request for Proposals to be prepared by the Client for the selection of Consultants.
 - 1.19 "**Services**" means the consulting services work to be performed by the Consultant pursuant to the Contract.
 - 1.20 "**Subconsultant**" means an entity to whom the Consultant intends to subcontract any part of the Services while remaining responsible to the Client during the performance of the Contract.
 - 1.21 "**TORs**" (this Section V of the RFP) means the Terms of Reference that explain the objectives, scope of work, activities, and tasks to be performed, respective responsibilities of the Client and the Consultant, and expected results and deliverables of the Services.

- 2 **Introduction**
 - 2.1 The Client named in the **Data Sheet** intends to select a Consultant, in accordance with the method of selection specified in the **Data Sheet**.
 - 2.2 The Consultants are invited to submit a Technical Proposal and a Financial Proposal for the Services named in the **Data Sheet**. The Proposal will be the basis for negotiating and ultimately signing the Contract with the selected Consultant.
 - 2.3 The Consultant should take into account the Applicable law in preparing their Proposals. They may attend a pre-Proposal conference if one is specified in the **Data Sheet**. Attending any such pre-Proposal conference is optional and is at the Consultant's expense.
 - 2.4 The Client will timely provide, at no cost to the Consultants, the inputs, relevant project data, and reports required for the preparation of the Consultant's Proposal if specified in the **Data Sheet**.
- 3 **Conflict of interest**
 - 3.1 The Consultant is required to provide professional, objective, and impartial advice, at all times holding the Client's interests paramount, strictly avoiding conflicts with other assignments or its own corporate interests, and acting without any consideration for future work.
 - 3.2 The Consultant has an obligation to disclose to the Client any situation of actual or potential conflict of interest that impacts its capacity to serve the best interest of its Client. Failure to disclose such situations may lead to the rejection of the Consultant's Proposal or the termination of its Contract.
 - 3.3 Without limitation on the generality of the foregoing, and unless stated otherwise in the **Data Sheet**, the Consultant shall not be hired under the circumstances set forth below:
 - 3.3.1 Conflicting activities
 - 3.3.1.1 Conflict between consulting activities and procurement of goods, works or non-consulting services: a firm that has been engaged by the Client to provide goods, works, or non-consulting services for a project, or any of its Affiliates, shall be disqualified from providing consulting services resulting from or directly related to those goods, works, or non-consulting services. Conversely, a firm hired to provide consulting services for the preparation or implementation of a project, or any of its Affiliates, shall be disqualified from subsequently providing goods or works or non-consulting services resulting from or directly related to the consulting services for such preparation or implementation.
 - 3.3.2 Conflicting assignments
 - 3.3.2.1 Conflict among consulting assignments: a Consultant (including its Experts and Subconsultants) or any of its Affiliates shall not be hired for any assignment that, by its nature, may be in conflict with another assignment of the Consultant for the same or for another Client.
 - 3.3.3 Conflicting relationships
 - 3.3.3.1 Relationship with the Client's staff: a Consultant (including its Experts and Subconsultants) that has a close business or family relationship with a professional staff of the Client who are directly or indirectly involved in any part of (i) the preparation of the Terms of Reference for the Services, (ii) the selection process for the Contract, or (iii) the supervision of the Contract, may not be awarded a Contract, unless the conflict stemming from this relationship has been resolved in a manner acceptable to NIUA throughout the selection process and the execution of the Contract.

- 3.4 Conflict of interest may arise between the Client and a Consultant or between Consultants and present or future concessionaires/ contractors. Some of the situations that would involve conflict of interest are identified below:
 - 3.4.1 Client and Consultants
 - 3.4.1.1 Potential Consultant should not be privy to information from the Client which is not available to others;
 - 3.4.1.2 Potential Consultant should not have defined the project when earlier working for the Client;
 - 3.4.1.3 Potential Consultant should not have recently worked for the Client overseeing the project.
 - 3.4.2 Consultants and concessionaires/ contractors
 - 3.4.2.1 No Consultant should have an ownership interest or a continuing business interest or an on-going relationship with a potential concessionaire/ contractor save and except relationships restricted to project-specific and short-term assignments; or
 - 3.4.2.2 No Consultant should be involved in owning or operating entities resulting from the project; or
 - 3.4.2.3 No Consultant should bid for works arising from the project
- 4 **Unfair competitive advantage**
 - 4.1 Fairness and transparency in the selection process require that the Consultants or their Affiliates competing for a specific assignment do not derive a competitive advantage from having provided consulting services related to the assignment in question. To that end, the Client shall indicate in the **Data Sheet** and make available to all Consultants together with this RFP all information that would in that respect give such Consultant any unfair competitive advantage over other competing Consultants.
- 5 **Corrupt and fraudulent practices**
 - 5.1 NIUA's Anti-corruption Policy requires Consultants, Bidders, Suppliers, and Contractors observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of such contracts. In pursuance of this policy, NIUA
 - a. defines, for the purposes of this provision, the terms set forth below as follows:
 - (i) "corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, anything of value to influence improperly the actions of another party;
 - (ii) "fraudulent practice" means any act or omission, including a misrepresentation, that knowingly or recklessly misleads, or attempts to mislead, a party to obtain a financial or other benefit or to avoid an obligation;
 - (iii) "coercive practice" means impairing or harming, or threatening to impair or harm, directly or indirectly, any party or the property of the party to influence improperly the actions of a party;
 - (iv) "collusive practice" means an arrangement between two or more parties designed to achieve an improper purpose, including influencing improperly the actions of another party;
 - (v) "obstructive practice" means (a) deliberately destroying, falsifying, altering, or concealing of evidence material from the Client's investigation; (b) making false statements to investigators in order to materially impede Client's investigation; (c) failing to comply with requests to provide information, documents, or records in connection with investigation; (d) threatening, harassing, or intimidating any party to prevent it from disclosing its knowledge of matters relevant to the investigation or from pursuing the investigation; or (e) materially impeding Client 's contractual rights of audit or access to information; and
 - (vi) "integrity violation" is any act which violates Client's Anti-corruption Policy, including (i) to (v) above and the following: abuse, conflict of

interest, violations of sanctions, retaliation against whistle-blowers or witnesses, and other violations of Anti-corruption Policy, including failure to adhere to the highest ethical standard.

- b. will reject a proposal for award if it determines that the Bidder recommended for award has, directly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, or obstructive practices or other integrity violations in competing for the Contract.

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| 6 Eligibility | 6.1 | Government officials and civil servants are not eligible to be included as Experts in the Consultant's Proposal unless such engagement does not conflict with the Applicable law, and they (i) are on leave of absence without pay, or have resigned or retired; (ii) are not being hired by the same agency they were working for before going on leave of absence without pay, resigning, or retiring; and (iii) their hiring would not create a conflict of interest. |
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B. Preparation of Proposals

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| 7 General considerations | 7.1 | In preparing the Proposal, the Consultant is expected to examine the RFP in detail. Material deficiencies in providing the information requested in the RFP may result in rejection of the Proposal. |
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| 8 Cost of preparation of Proposal | 8.1 | The Consultant shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its Proposal, and the Client shall not be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the selection process. |
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| 9 Language | 9.1 | The Proposal, as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the Proposal exchanged between the Consultant and the Client shall be written in the language(s) specified in the Data Sheet . |
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| 10 Documents comprising the Proposal | 10.1 | The Proposal shall comprise the documents and forms listed in the Data Sheet . |
| | 10.2 | The Consultant shall furnish information on commissions, gratuities, and fees, if any, paid or to be paid to agents or any other party relating to this Proposal, if awarded, Contract execution. |
| | 10.3 | A Bid Securing Declaration should be submitted, if specified in the Data Sheet . |

- 10.3.1 In lieu of Bid Security, all Consultants shall furnish/ upload a Bid Securing Declaration (BSD) as Form TECH-9: 'Bid Securing Declaration', along with its Technical Proposal. The Bid Securing Declaration is required to protect the Client against the risk of the Consultant's unwarranted conduct as amplified under the sub-clause below.

- 10.3.2 The Bid Securing Declaration provides for automatic suspension of the Consultant from being eligible for bidding in any tender in the Ministry/ Department of Client for 2 years from the date of such enforcement. This declaration shall stand enforced if the Consultant breaches the following obligation(s) under the RFP:

- a) withdraws or amends his Proposal or impairs or derogates from the Proposal in any respect within the period of validity of its Proposal; or
- b) after having been notified within the period of Proposal validity of the acceptance of his Proposal by the Client:
 - i. refuses to or fails to submit the original documents for scrutiny or the required Performance Security within the stipulated time as per the RFP document's conditions.
 - ii. fails or refuses to sign the contract.

- 10.3.3 Unsuccessful Consultants' Bid-Securing Declaration shall expire if the contract is not awarded to them upon:

- a) receipt by Consultant of the Client's notification
 - i. of cancellation of the entire Procurement Process or rejection of all Proposals or

- ii. of the name of the successful Consultant or
- b) forty-five days after the expiration of the Proposal validity or any extension thereof

10.3.4 The Bid-Securing Declaration of the successful Consultant shall stand expired only when the Consultant has furnished the required Performance Security and signed the Agreement.

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| 11 Only one Proposal | 11.1 The Consultant shall submit only one Proposal. If a Consultant submits or participates in more than one Proposal, all such Proposals shall be disqualified and rejected. This does not, however, unless otherwise stated in the Data Sheet , preclude a Subconsultant, or the Consultant's staff from participating as Key Experts and Non-Key Experts in more than one Proposal. |
| 12 Proposal validity | <p>12.1 The Data Sheet indicates the period during which the Consultant's Proposal must remain valid after the Proposal submission deadline.</p> <p>12.2 During this period, the Consultant shall maintain its original Proposal without any change, including the availability of the Key Experts, the proposed rates and the total price.</p> <p>12.3 If it is established that any Key Expert nominated in the Consultant's Proposal was not available at the time of Proposal submission or was included in the Proposal without his/her confirmation, such Proposal shall be disqualified and rejected for further evaluation.</p> <p>12.4 <u>Extension of validity period</u></p> <p style="padding-left: 20px;">12.4.1 The Client will make its best effort to complete the negotiations within the Proposal's validity period. | 13 Clarification and amendment of RFP | 13.1 The Consultant may request a clarification of any part of the RFP during the period indicated in the Data Sheet before the Proposals' submission deadline. Any request for clarification must be sent in writing, or by standard electronic means, to the Client's address indicated in the Data Sheet . The Client will respond in writing, or by standard electronic means, and will send written copies of the response (including an explanation of the query but without identifying its source) to all Consultants. Should the Client deem it necessary to amend the RFP as a result of a clarification, it shall do so following the procedure described below: |

- 13.1.1 At any time before the Proposal submission deadline, the Client may amend the RFP by issuing an amendment in writing or by standard electronic means. The amendment shall be uploaded on NIUA website and will be sent to all Consultants and will be binding on them. The Consultants shall acknowledge receipt of all amendments in writing.
- 13.1.2 If the amendment is substantial, the Client shall extend the Proposal submission deadline to give the Consultants reasonable time to take an amendment into account in their Proposals.
- 13.2 The Consultant may submit a modified Proposal or a modification to any part of it at any time prior to the Proposal submission deadline. No modifications to the Technical or Financial Proposal shall be accepted after the deadline.
- 14 Preparation of Proposals – Specific consideration**
- 14.1 While preparing the Proposal, the Consultant must give particular attention to the following:
- 14.1.1 If a Consultant considers that it may enhance its expertise for the Services by associating with other consultants in the form of a Joint Venture or Consortium, it may do so if permitted in **Data Sheet**.
- 14.1.2 The Client may indicate in the **Data Sheet** the estimated Key Experts’ time input (expressed in person-month) or the Client’s estimated total cost of the Services, but not both. This estimate is indicative and the Proposal shall be based on the Consultant’s own estimates for the same.
- 14.1.3 If stated in the **Data Sheet**, the Consultant shall include in its Proposal at least the same time input (in the same unit as indicated in the **Data Sheet**) of Key Experts, failing which the financial Proposal will be rejected.
- 14.1.4 For assignments under the Fixed-Budget selection method, the estimated Key Experts’ time input is not disclosed. Total available budget, with an indication whether it is inclusive or exclusive of taxes, is given in the **Data Sheet**, and the financial Proposal shall not exceed this budget.
- 15 Technical Proposal format and content**
- 15.1 The Technical Proposal shall not include any information regarding the Financial Proposal. A Technical Proposal containing any information regarding the Financial Proposal shall be declared non-responsive.
- 15.1.1 Consultant shall not propose alternative Key Experts. Only one CV shall be submitted for each Key Expert position. Failure to comply with this requirement will make the Proposal non-responsive.
- 15.1.2 Variations are not allowed.
- 15.2 The Technical Proposal shall be prepared using the standard forms provided in **Section IV** of the RFP.
- 16 Financial Proposal**
- 16.1 The Financial Proposal shall be prepared using the standard forms provided in **Section IV** of the RFP.
- 16.2 Taxes
The Financial Proposal should clearly estimate, the taxes, duties, fees, levies and other charges imposed under the Applicable law, on the Consultants, the Subconsultants, and their Experts, as stated in the **Data Sheet**. The Consultant and its Subconsultants and Experts are responsible for meeting all tax liabilities arising out of the Contract unless stated otherwise in the **Data Sheet**. Information on taxes is provided in the **Data Sheet**.
- 16.3 Currency of Proposal
The Consultant may express the price for its Services in the currency or currencies as stated in the **Data Sheet**. If indicated in the **Data Sheet**, the portion of the price representing local cost shall be stated in the local currency.
- C. Submission, Opening and Evaluation**
- 17 Submission, sealing and**
- 17.1 The Consultant shall submit a signed and complete Proposal comprising the documents and forms (Documents comprising Proposal). If authorised in the **Data Sheet**, the Consultant may choose to submit its Proposals electronically.

marking of Proposals

- 17.2 An authorised representative of the Consultant shall sign the original submission letters in the required format for both the Technical Proposal and the Financial Proposal and shall initial all pages of both. The authorisation shall be in the form of a written Power of Attorney attached to the Technical Proposal.
 - 17.2.1 A Proposal submitted by a Joint Venture shall be signed by all members so as to be legally binding on all members, or by an authorized representative who has a written power of attorney signed by each member's authorized representative
- 17.3 Any modifications, revisions, interlineations, erasures, or overwriting shall be valid only if they are signed or initialled by the person signing the Proposal.
- 17.4 The signed Technical and Financial Proposals shall be marked "**ORIGINAL**", and its copies marked "**COPY**" as appropriate. The number of copies is indicated in the **Data Sheet**. All copies shall be made from the signed original. If there are discrepancies between the original and the copies, the original shall prevail.
- 17.5 The original and all the copies of the Technical Proposal shall be placed inside of a sealed envelope clearly marked "**TECHNICAL PROPOSAL, [Name of the Services]**", reference number, name and address of the Consultant, and with a warning "**DO NOT OPEN UNTIL TECHNICAL PROPOSAL OPENING**".
- 17.6 Similarly, the original Financial Proposal shall be placed inside of a sealed envelope clearly marked "**FINANCIAL PROPOSAL, [name of the Services]**", reference number, name and address of the Consultant, and with a warning "**DO NOT OPEN WITH THE TECHNICAL PROPOSAL**".
- 17.7 The sealed envelopes containing the Technical and Financial Proposals shall be placed into one outer envelope and sealed. This outer envelope shall bear the submission address, RFP reference number, the name of the Services, Consultant's name and the address, and shall be clearly marked "**DO NOT OPEN BEFORE TECHNICAL PROPOSAL OPENING**".
- 17.8 If the envelopes and packages with the Proposal are not sealed and marked as required, the Client will assume no responsibility for the misplacement, loss, or premature opening of the Proposal.
- 17.9 The Proposal or its modifications must be sent to the address indicated in the **Data Sheet** and received by the Client no later than the deadline indicated in the **Data Sheet**, or any extension to this deadline. Any Proposal or its modification received by the Client after the deadline shall be declared late and rejected, and promptly returned unopened.

18 Confidentiality

- 18.1 From the time the Proposals are opened to the time the Contract is awarded, the Consultant should not contact the Client on any matter related to its Technical and/or Financial Proposal. Information relating to the evaluation of Proposals and award recommendations shall not be disclosed to the Consultants who submitted the Proposals or to any other party not officially concerned with the process, until the publication of the Contract award information.
- 18.2 Any attempt by Consultants or anyone on behalf of the Consultant to influence improperly the Client in the evaluation of the Proposals or Contract award decisions may result in the rejection of its Proposal.
- 18.3 Notwithstanding the above provisions, from the time of the Proposals' opening to the time of Contract award publication, if a Consultant wishes to contact the Client on any matter related to the selection process, it should do so only in writing.

19 Opening of Technical Proposals

- 19.1 The Client's evaluation committee shall conduct the opening of the Technical Proposals in the presence of the Consultants' authorised representatives who choose to attend (in person, or online if this option is offered in the **Data Sheet**). The opening date, time and address are stated in the **Data Sheet**. The envelopes with the Financial Proposal shall remain sealed and shall be securely stored with a reputable public auditor or independent authority until they are opened in accordance with Clause 23 of the ITC.

- 19.2 At the opening of the Technical Proposals the following shall be read out: (i) the name of the Consultant or, in case of a Joint Venture, the name of the Joint Venture, the name of the lead member and the names of all members; (ii) the presence or absence of a duly sealed envelope with the Financial Proposal; (iii) any modifications to the Proposal submitted prior to Proposal submission deadline; and (iv) any other information deemed appropriate or as indicated in the **Data Sheet**.
- 20 Proposals evaluation**
- 20.1 Subject to provision of Sub-Clause 15.1 of the ITC, the evaluators of the Technical Proposals shall have no access to the Financial Proposals until the technical evaluation is concluded.
- 20.2 The Consultant is not permitted to alter or modify its Proposal in any way after the Proposal submission deadline except as permitted. While evaluating the Proposals, the Client will conduct the evaluation solely on the basis of the submitted Technical and Financial Proposals.
- 21 Evaluation of Technical Proposals**
- 21.1 The Client's evaluation committee shall evaluate the Technical Proposals on the basis of their responsiveness to the Terms of Reference and the RFP, applying the evaluation criteria, sub-criteria, and point system specified in the **Data Sheet**. Each responsive Proposal will be given a technical score. A Proposal shall be rejected at this stage if it does not respond to important aspects of the RFP or if it fails to achieve the minimum technical score indicated in the **Data Sheet**.
- 22 Financial Proposals for QBS**
- 22.1 Following the ranking of the Technical Proposals, when the selection is based on quality only (QBS), the top-ranked Consultant is invited to negotiate the Contract. Only the Financial Proposal of the technically top-ranked Consultant is opened by the Client's evaluation committee. All other Financial Proposals are returned unopened after the Contract negotiations are successfully concluded and the Contract is signed.
- 23 Public opening of financial Proposals (for Quality and Cost Based Selection (QCBS), Fixed Budget Selection (FBS), and Least-Cost Selection (LCS) methods)**
- 23.1 After the technical evaluation is completed, the Client shall notify in writing those Bidders that have achieved the minimum overall technical score and inform them of the date, time and location for the opening of the Financial Proposals. The opening date should allow the Bidder sufficient time to make arrangements for attending the opening. The Consultant's attendance at the opening of the financial Proposals (in person, or online if such option is indicated in the **Data Sheet**) is optional and is at the Consultant's choice.
- 23.2 The Financial Proposals shall be opened by the Client's evaluation committee in the presence of the representatives of those Consultants whose Proposals have passed the minimum technical score. At the opening, the names of the Consultants, the overall technical scores, and the total prices shall be read aloud and recorded. Copies of the record shall be sent to all Consultants who submitted Proposals. All other Financial Proposals are returned unopened after the Contract negotiations are successfully concluded and the Contract is signed.
- 24 Correction of errors**
- 24.1 Activities and items described in the Technical Proposal but not priced in the Financial Proposal, shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other activities or items, and no corrections will be made to the Financial Proposal.
- 24.2 Time-based Contracts
In the case of a time-based Contract, the Client's evaluation committee will (a) correct any computational or arithmetical errors, and (b) adjust the prices if they fail to reflect all inputs included for the respective activities or items in the Technical Proposal. In case of discrepancy between (i) a partial amount (sub-total) and the total amount, or (ii) between the amount derived by multiplication of unit price with quantity and the total price, or (iii) between words and figures, the former will prevail. In case of discrepancy between the Technical and Financial Proposals in indicating quantities of input, the Technical Proposal prevails and the Client's evaluation committee shall correct the quantification indicated in the Financial Proposal so as to make it consistent with the one indicated in the Technical Proposal,

apply the relevant unit price included in the Financial Proposal to the corrected quantity, and correct the total Proposal cost.

24.3 Lump-sum Contracts

In the case of a Lump-sum Contract, the Consultant is deemed to have included all inputs that are necessary to perform the Services in the Financial Proposal, so neither arithmetical corrections nor price adjustments shall be made. The total price, net or inclusive of taxes understood as per Clause ITC 25 below, specified in the Financial Proposal (form FIN-1) shall be considered as the offered price.

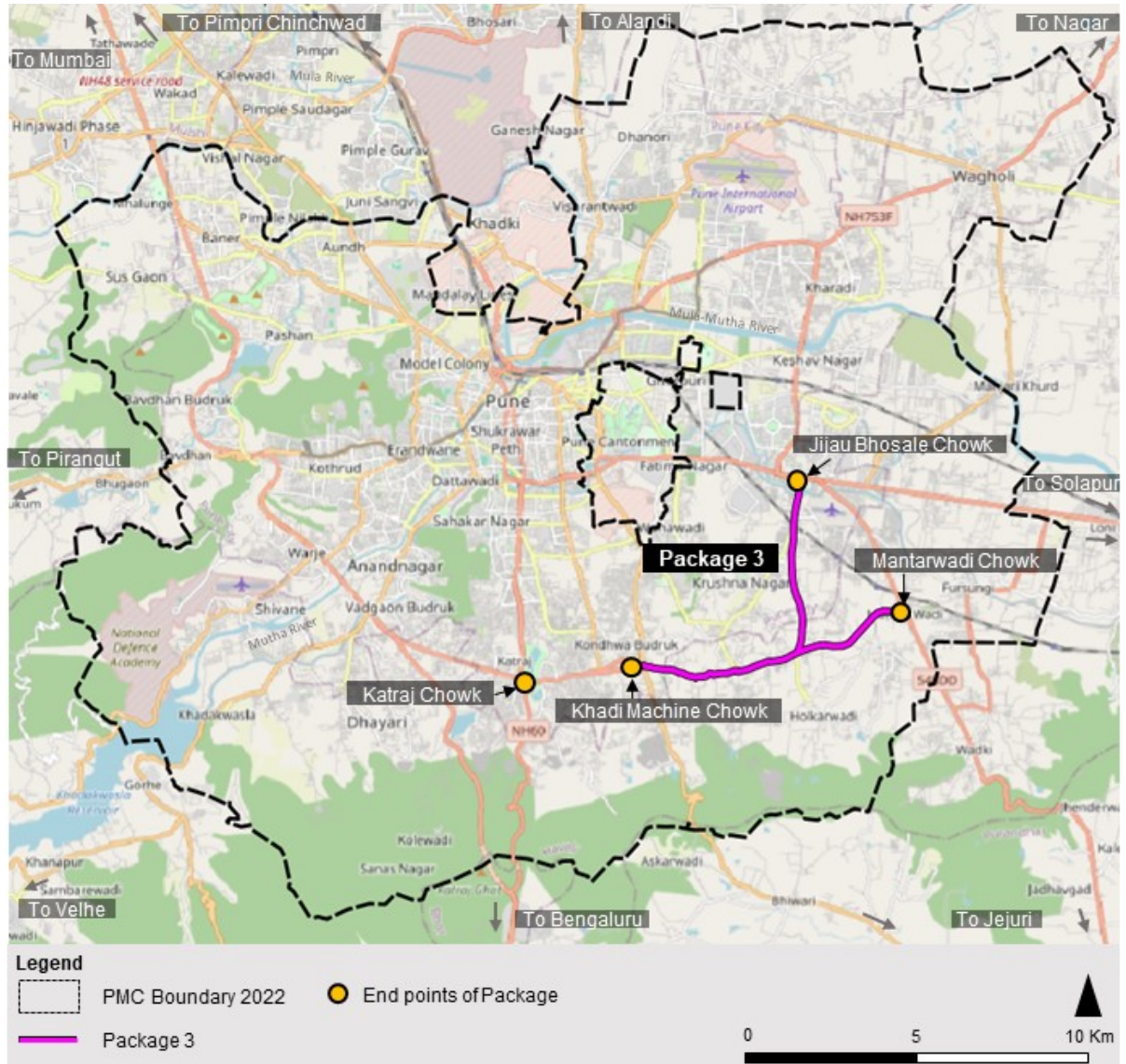

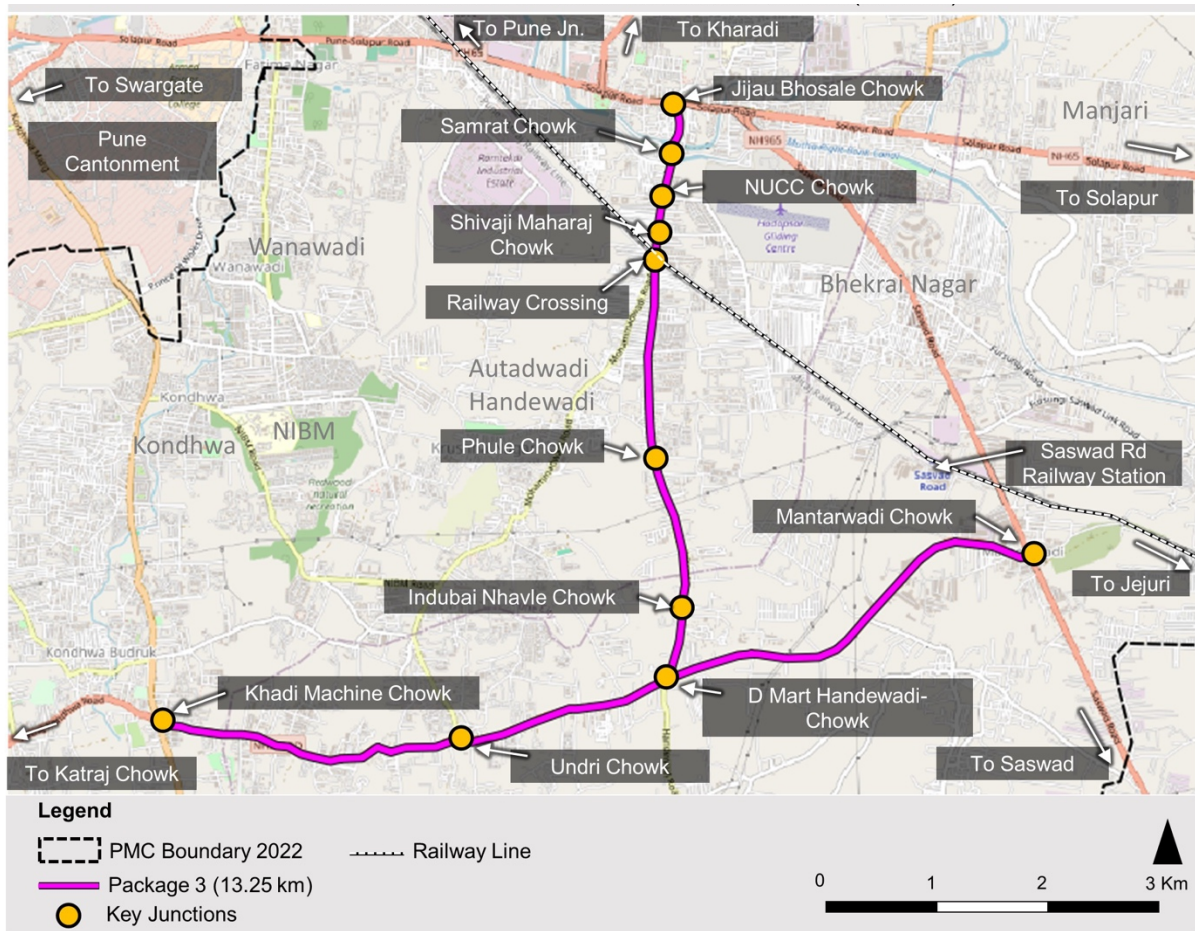
Map 1 : Location of Package 3 Corridor in Pune

This RfP pertains to the development of C&JIP for Package 3: Corridor 1: Rajmata Jijau Bhosale Chowk to D Mart Chowk, Handewadi, Corridor 2: Khadi Machine Chowk to Mantarwadi Chowk.

The design proposals must consider the recommendations in the development plans (Draft Development Plan - Pune Metropolitan Region (2021-41), Draft Development Plan for Old Pune Municipal Corporation (PMC) Limit (2007-2027), etc.) for the area around these corridors and any ongoing and future development proposals that may impact the traffic on these corridors. The C&JIPs must be cognisant of future travel demand during peak and non-peak hours on weekdays as well as weekends.

B. Scope of Work

1. Conduct comprehensive **case studies of improvement plans** for diverse street and junction typologies with varying adjacent land use contexts. The case studies should include the methodology followed to test and implement proposed design solutions, and its impact in terms of reduced GHG emissions, increased travel efficiencies, equitable distribution of road space, enhanced road safety, etc. Case studies from Germany (Essen and Nuremberg), Copenhagen, Spain (Burgos), Colombia (Bogota), USA (New York), Turkey (Istanbul), Hong Kong, China (Shanghai), South Korea (Seoul), Goa and Delhi may be considered. The consultants should not limit themselves to the above-mentioned case studies.
2. Review extant policies, regulations and guidelines related to the development of roads, corridors, junctions, and public spaces. Suggestive list of documents to be reviewed should include, but not be limited to, the following:

- a. Urban Street Design Guidelines (USDG), Pune, published by Pune Municipal Corporation (Version I, 2016)
 - b. Other Guidelines/Plans published by Pune Municipal Corporation: School Priority Zone Guidelines (August 2023), Speedbreaker Guidelines for Pune (2022), Pune EV Readiness Plan (2022), Road Safety Improvement Plan (2018), etc.
 - c. Street Design Guidelines published by other agencies/ organisations like Delhi Urban Arts Commission (2020), Delhi Development Authority (UTTIPED, Revision I, 2010), ITDP (2019), etc.
 - d. Manuals and guidance documents for designing streets in cities like New York, Amsterdam, London, etc.
 - e. Guidelines published by Indian Roads Congress (IRC)
 - IRC codes for reference (but not limited to), are as below:
 - IRC-SP-41-1994: Guidelines for Design of At Grade Intersection in Rural and Urban Areas
 - IRC-92-1985: Guidelines for Design of Interchanges in Urban Areas
 - IRC-93-1985: Guidelines on Design and Installation of Road Traffic Signals
 - IRC-106-1990: Guidelines for Capacity of Urban Roads in Plan Areas
 - IRC-103-1988: Guidelines for Pedestrian Facilities
 - IRC-86-1983: Geometric Design Standards for Urban Roads in Plains
 - IRC-70-1977: Guidelines on Regulation and Control of Mixed Traffic in Urban Areas
 - f. Review of development plans (Draft Development Plan - Pune Metropolitan Region (2021 - 2041), Draft Development Plan for Old Pune Municipal Corporation (PMC) Limit (2007 - 2027), etc.) for recommendations for the said corridor.
3. Undertake a detailed Total Station Survey (TSS)/ Differential Global Positioning System (DGPS)/ 3D Mobile LiDAR Survey technique to map the following:
 - a. entire length of the corridors including all junctions, bus-bays, pick-up and drop-off points, metro stations, offshoot roads (up to 150 m length or adjoining secondary junction whichever is closer), adjoining uses, entry and exit points of surrounding plots, traffic calming measures, streets infrastructure, trees, etc.;
 - b. entire Right of Way (RoW) as per the Draft Development Plan (2021 - 2041) up to 100m width beyond the DP RoW; and
 - c. plots/ buildings (including compound wall, trees, street light poles, utility, etc.) falling fully and partly inside DP RoW limits (that may get affected due to DP road widening), have to be surveyed completely.
 4. The Consultant shall also be responsible for,
 - a. procuring information of the adjoining land (village maps, survey maps, revenue maps and subdivision layouts, *phalni* 12 maps, etc.) from the Revenue Department and District Land Records Department, Office of District Collector, Pune;
 - b. superimposing the TSS/ DGPS map on village maps, survey maps and revenue maps with *gat* numbers;
 - c. marking the DP RoW on map and due verification of the same from the Building Permission and Zoning Department, PMC; and
 - d. preparing and submit a Survey Report with details of properties that would be affected while implementing the RoW prescribed by the Draft Development Plan - Pune Metropolitan Region (2021-41): a separate map (with area details), names of owners, individual area statements of each land parcel, etc. The Survey Report will also provide detailed cost estimate for land acquisition as per the provisions of the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013.
 5. Undertake the following surveys to map the current traffic situation and the condition assessment of the selected corridors (and junctions):

- a. Traffic volume: Directional (peak and non-peak hour volume counts at survey locations along with vehicular composition commercial goods vehicles, buses (inter- and intra-city), minibuses, cars (private/non-commercial or commercial), IPTs, etc.)
- b. Turning movement surveys of vehicles at turns/ junctions
- c. Travel speed delay survey
- d. Traffic queue length survey
- e. Road Inventory survey
- f. On-street pedestrian and cyclist volume count
- g. Pedestrian and cyclist safety survey
- h. Parking demand survey (on-street and off-street parking)
- i. Vendor survey
- j. Road User Satisfaction Survey
- k. Activity mapping
- l. Mapping of accessibility and gender-based challenges and issues
- m. Any additional surveys deemed necessary for completing the assignment

The traffic survey formats will be approved by the PMC and PMU/ PIU - UrbanShift, NIUA. The above-mentioned surveys will be conducted during peak and non-peak hours of weekdays and weekends.

6. Analyse the data generated from the traffic surveys to identify key traffic trends and patterns, and potential areas for improvement or intervention.
7. Using the outcomes of the TSS/ DGPS/ 3D Mobile LiDAR and road inventory surveys, prepare a Base Map of the selected corridor (and junctions) showing the corridor and junction alignment, metro stations and its alignment, adjacent uses, street names and classifications, landmarks, public spaces, green spaces, water bodies, lane-segregation, pedestrian pathways, crosswalks, vehicular and pedestrian signals, bicycle lanes, underground utility network (particularly the storm water drainage), street lighting, utility poles, safety and emergency services, lane configurations, intersection geometries, green belts, avenue plantations, etc. The Base Map should have dimensions, slopes, level difference, etc. properly marked. The Base Map must be GIS-based to ensure accurate spatial alignment and correlation with real-world geographic coordinates.

*The PMC will coordinate with the traffic police and all relevant departments/agencies to plan and facilitate the TSS/ DGPS/ 3D Mobile LiDAR and road inventory surveys mentioned above. All measures to ensure the safety of the traffic survey team must be implemented by the Consultant, including thorough risk assessment, establishment of clear communication protocols, provision of appropriate safety gear for the surveyors, installation of safety barriers and signages, etc.

8. Consider the existing and projected travel demand, prepare a Draft C&JIP for selected corridors, junctions and offshoot roads emanating from the junction up to 150 m length or adjoining secondary junction whichever is closer. The design proposal must highlight lands that have to be compulsorily acquired to maintain a consistent width of the RoW and establish continuity of the service roads, footpaths, cycling tracks, etc.
9. The Draft C&JIP must propose a design solution to,
 - a. reduce congestion, optimize travel time and enhance safety on selected corridors (and junctions). This could be done by improving road geometries (intersection design enhancements, realigning lane configurations, organising bus bays and pick-up and drop-off points, addressing hazardous conditions and minimizing the risk of accidents, etc.), etc.
 - b. improve integration and coordination between different modes of transportation, such as vehicles, public transit, cyclists, and pedestrians, to create a more efficient and accessible transportation network;

- c. enhance facilities and infrastructure for pedestrians, cyclists and Persons with Disability (PwD), including sidewalks, crosswalks, bike lanes, shared-use paths, public plazas and landscape improvements to encourage active transportation and accessibility;
 - d. plan and provision/ optimise parking to alleviate parking shortages and reduce parking-related traffic congestion;
 - e. support economic development and revitalization efforts by improving access to uses (businesses and commercial areas) along corridors and at junctions;
 - f. integrate smart advertisement, information displays, landscape and urban art to enhance the overall functionality, safety and aesthetics of the corridor;
 - g. propose an integrated network of storm water drains (focus should be on use of Nature-based Solutions – bio-infiltration measures, subject to feasibility); and
 - h. promote environmental sustainability by encouraging the use of low-carbon transportation options, such as electric vehicles, and incorporating green infrastructure elements into corridor and junction designs.
10. The Draft C&JIP must be submitted as a Comprehensive Layout Plan (with all dimensions, slopes, level difference, material specifications and road markings – lane delineation (including road widening proposals, if any), traffic calming measures, bus bays, pick-up and drop-off points, parking, street utilities, landscape elements, storm water drainage, street lights, etc.). For legibility of the drawings, the Consultant is also required to submit the following plans separately:
- a. Parking Plan (including location of EV charging infrastructure)
 - b. Landscape and Beautification Plan (with planting species details, c/c distance of planting, design details of public plazas, etc.)
 - c. Utility Plan (with layout of underground utilities, location of utility boxes, etc.)
 - d. Street Utility Plan (with street furniture, public conveniences with breast feeding room, Multi-utility Zone (MUZ) marked for vendors, public plazas, etc.)
 - e. Signage plan
 - f. Emergency Vehicle Movement Plan
 - g. Paving Plan (tactile paving, pervious paving, use of local materials, etc.)
 - h. Any other plans required to provide clarity to the design proposal
- All plans must be accompanied by mid-block sections wherever there is a change in usage, width, level difference, etc. The following additional details should also be provided:
- a. Bollard detail
 - b. Tree grating detail
 - c. Seating detail
 - d. Street light details
 - e. Ramp detail
 - f. Any other details required to successfully implement the C&JIP
- All drawings must be prepared using AutoCAD software and should be geo-referenced. The physical as well as digital copy of all drawings should be submitted by the Consultant.
11. To test the proposed Draft C&JIP, undertake traffic movement and junction simulation (using appropriate softwares) for the existing and the projected traffic volume. The projected traffic volume should be estimated on the basis of the population and vehicular growth projections (and other similar factors) as adopted in the Draft DP and CMP of Pune city.
12. Assess the impact of the Draft C&JIP on reducing GHG emissions and other vehicular pollutants (including particulate matter) by analysing changes in vehicle emissions, traffic flow efficiency, and mode shift towards sustainable transportation options such as walking, cycling, and public transit.
13. Prepare cost estimates (Capital and Maintenance) as per PMC'S Schedule of Rates (SoR) for the Draft C&JIP. Materials, in addition to the items mentioned in the SoR, additional materials can be

recommended to enhance the sustainability of the design solution. The capital cost estimate will encompass the expenses associated with the proposed enhancements outlined in the C&JIP. The maintenance cost estimate will include expenditures for landscaping and street upkeep, covering tasks such as street cleaning, pavement replacement (overlays), decorative pavement replacement, pedestrian street lighting, sidewalk sweeping, and landscape maintenance (including watering, weeding, and replacement). The maintenance cost will be projected for the next 10 years.

14. Support the PMC in engaging with local stakeholders (resident welfare associations, market and trader associations, industrial associations, institutions, etc.) to receive feedback on the Draft C&JIP to ensure that the Draft Plan reflects their needs and priorities, and contribute to creating more livable and vibrant neighbourhoods. The list of local stakeholders must be approved by the PMC and PMU/ PIU - UrbanShift, NIUA. This activity may require multiple meetings/consultations with the local stakeholders.
15. Finalise the C&JIP (works mentioned in Clause 8 - 13 above) based on the inputs received from NIUA, UNEP, PMC and other stakeholders. In consultation with the PMC, prepare a phased implementation plan considering budgetary constraints and priorities.
16. The Consultant shall prepare the tender documents comprising the technical specification, BOQ, General Terms and Conditions, Special Conditions etc. for inviting tenders for implementation of the C&JIP.

This Agreement (hereinafter called the Integrity Pact) is made on ____ day of the month of ____ 2025 at _____, India.

BETWEEN

National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA), through Director, NIUA (hereinafter called the “Client”, which expression shall mean and include unless the context otherwise requires, his successors in office and assigns) of the First Part

AND

M/s _____ (hereinafter called the “Consultant” which expression shall mean and include, unless the context otherwise requires, his successors and permitted assigns) of the Second Part.

PREAMBLE

‘Client’ intends to award, under laid down organizational procedures, contract/ s for _____, ‘Client’ values full compliance with all relevant laws of the land, rules, regulations, economic use of resources and of fairness/ transparency in its relations with its Consultant(s).

Section 1 - Commitments of the ‘Client’

(1) ‘Client’ commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption and to observe the following principles: -

- a. No employee of the Client, personally or through family members, shall, in connection with the tender for, or the execution of a contract, demand, take a promise for or accept, for self or third person, any material or immaterial benefit which the person is not legally entitled to.
- b. The Client shall, during the Procurement Process, treat all Consultant(s) with equity and reason. The Client shall, in particular, before and during the Procurement Process, provide to all Consultant(s) the same information and shall not provide to any Consultant(s) confidential/ additional information through which the Consultant(s) could obtain an advantage in relation to the Procurement Process or the contract execution.
- c. The Client shall exclude from the process all known prejudiced persons.

(2) If the Client obtains information on the conduct of any of its employees, which is a criminal offence under the IPC/ PC Act, or if there be a substantive suspicion in this regard, the Client shall inform the Chief Vigilance Officer and in addition, can initiate disciplinary actions.

Section 2 - Commitments of the ‘Consultant’

(1) The 'Consultant' commit themselves to taking all measures necessary to prevent corruption. The 'Consultant' commit themselves to observe the following principles during participation in the Procurement Process and during the contract execution.

a. The 'Consultant' shall not, directly or through any other person or firm, offer, promise, or give to any of the Client's employees involved in the Procurement Process or the execution of the contract or to any third person any material or other benefit which he is not legally entitled to, in order to obtain in exchange any advantage of any kind whatsoever during the Procurement Process or during the execution of the contract.

b. The 'Consultant' shall not enter any undisclosed agreement or understanding with other Consultants, whether formal or informal. This applies in particular to prices, specifications, certifications, subsidiary contracts, submission or non-submission of Proposals or any other actions to restrict competitiveness or to introduce cartelisation in the Procurement Process.

c. The 'Consultant' shall not commit any offence under the relevant IPC/ PC Act; further, the 'Consultant' shall not use improperly, for purposes of competition or personal gain, or pass on to others, any information or document provided by the Client as part of the business relationship, regarding plans, technical proposals, and business details, including information contained or transmitted electronically.

d. The 'Consultant' of foreign origin shall disclose the name and address of the Agents/ representatives in India if any. Similarly, the Consultants of Indian Nationality shall furnish the name and address of the foreign principals, if any. Further details as mentioned in the "Guidelines on Indian Agents of Foreign Suppliers" shall be disclosed by the Consultant. Further, as mentioned in the Guidelines, all the payments made to the Indian agent/ representative have to be in Indian Rupees only.

e. The 'Consultant' shall, when presenting their Proposal, disclose any and all payments made, are committed to, or intends to make to agents, brokers, or any other intermediaries in connection with the award of the contract.

(2) The 'Consultant' shall not instigate third persons to commit offences outlined above or be an accessory to such offences.

Section 3 - Disqualification from Procurement Process and exclusion from future contracts

If the 'Consultant', before award or during execution, has committed a transgression through a violation of Section 2, above or in any other form such as to put their reliability or credibility in question, the Client is entitled to disqualify the 'Consultant' from the Procurement Process or take action as per the procedure mentioned in the "Guidelines on Banning of business dealings".

Section 4 - Compensation for Damages

(1) If the Client has disqualified the 'Consultant' from the Procurement Process prior to the award according to Section 3, the Client is entitled to demand and recover from 'Consultant' the damages equivalent to Earnest Money Deposit/ Bid Security.

(2) If the Client has terminated the contract according to Section 3, or if the Client is entitled to terminate the contract according to Section 3, the Client shall be entitled to demand and recover from the Consultant liquidated damages of the contract value or the amount equivalent to Performance Bank Guarantee.

Section 5 - Previous transgression

(1) Consultant declares that no previous transgressions occurred in the last three years with any other Company in any country conforming to the anti-corruption approach or with any Public Sector Enterprise in India that could justify his exclusion from the Procurement Process.

(2) If the Consultant makes an incorrect statement on this subject, he can be disqualified from the Procurement Process, or action can be taken as per the procedure mentioned in “Guidelines on Banning of business dealings”.

Section 6 - Equal treatment of all Consultants / Sub-consultants

(1) In the case of Sub-contracting, the Principal Consultant shall take responsibility for the adoption of the Integrity Pact by the Sub-consultants.

(2) The Client shall enter into agreements with identical conditions as this one with all Consultants.

(3) The Client shall disqualify from the Procurement Process all Consultants who do not sign this Pact or violate its provisions.

Section 7 - Criminal charges against violating Consultant(s)/ Sub-consultant(s)

If the Client obtains knowledge of the conduct of a Consultant or Sub-consultant, or of an employee or a representative or an associate of a Consultant or Sub-consultant, which constitutes corruption, or if the Client has substantive suspicion in this regard, the Client shall inform the same to the Chief Vigilance Officer.

Section 8 - Pact Duration

This Pact begins when both parties have legally signed it. It expires for the Consultant 12 months after the last payment under the contract. Any violation of the same would entail disqualification of the Consultants and exclusion from future business dealings.

If any claim is made/ lodged during this time, the same shall be binding and continue to be valid despite the lapse of this pact as specified above unless it is discharged/ determined by the Head of the Client.

Section 9 - Other provisions

(1) This agreement is subject to Indian Law. The place of performance and jurisdiction is the Registered Office of the Client, i.e., New Delhi.

(2) Changes and supplements, as well as termination notices, need to be made in writing. Side agreements have not been made.

(3) If the Consultant is a partnership or a consortium, this agreement must be signed by all partners or consortium members.

(4) Should one or several provisions of this agreement turn out to be invalid, the remainder of this agreement remains valid. In this case, the parties shall strive to come to an agreement with their original intentions.
